2018

Process and Definitions

Process

- The survey was sent to all Ontario Land Surveyors and Articling Students (this was part of a National study but only the Ontario portion is reported here)
- Initial responses were sent to an Accounting firm to ensure confidentiality
- The raw data with all potential identifying information removed was then sent to the AOLS Office for analysis
- All data was included except where noted
- Numbers from different views of the data will not match since not all members answered all the questions thereby making it impossible to include their returns in some analysis
- Returns were not provided where less than 4 members were in a category

Definitions

- 20% means 20% of the respondents make less than this
- Median is the middle value (half make less and half make more)
- 80% means 20% of the respondents make more than this

Other Notes

 The survey was completed in the summer of 2018 but given the numbers requested were annual, many of the returns would have been based on 2017 numbers

Summary of Respondents

- 268 responses were received from licensed and registered members of a possible 519 (52% response rate)
 - 4 licensed private practice consultants
 - 82 licensed private practice employees
 - 99 licensed private practice owners
 - 12 licensed federal employees
 - 33 licensed provincial employees
 - 15 licensed municipal employees
 - 6 registered private practice members
 - 5 registered public practice members
 - 5 licensed members working in some form of institution
 - 1 registered member working in some form of institution
 - 3 inactive members
 - 3 with information lacking
- 42 responses were received from articling students of a possible 75 (56% response rate)




